This recall notice has been expanded to include Serrano Peppers that were distributed Western Canada, Southern California, Washington, Alaska, and Texas (Dallas).

OTTAWA—The Canadian Food Inspection Agency is warning the public not to eat certain fresh jalapeno peppers because they may be contaminated with salmonella. The affected peppers were imported from the United States and sold unlabelled from bulk at Safeway stores and various independent stores in Alberta, B.C, Manitoba, Northwest Territories, Ontario, Saskatchewan and Yukon. They were also sold unlabelled from bulk or in 4.5 kilogram Cal Fresco brand cases. All of the affected jalapeno peppers were sold between Dec. 3 and 20, 2011, inclusively. There have been no reported illnesses associated with the consumption of these peppers. The importers are voluntarily recalling the affected product from the marketplace.

Green Valley Food Corp. "Let's Grow HealthyTogether!" Alfalfa Sprouts 5 oz. containers because of a possible health risk. The product, packaged in small plastic containers, was distributed to retail chains and food distribution centers in Texas, Green Valley said.
